Re:

NRS 484B.117 Driving a Vehicle Upon a Sidewalk

You have asked whether a person may ride a bicycle on a sidewalk.

NRS 484B.117 pr ovides, "[A] driver of a vehicle shall not drive upon or within any sidewalk area except at a permanent or temporary driveway or alley entrance."

The statutory definition of "Vehicle" excludes, "Devices moved by human power..." NRS 484A.025 defines bicycle as, "...a device propelled by human power upon which a person may ride, having two tandem wheels either of which is over 14 inches in diameter, or every such device generally recognized as a bicycle though equipped with two front or two rear wheels except a moped."

A person may operate a bicycle on a sidewalk because NRS 484B.117 only prohibits people driving vehicles from driving on sidewalks. That said, individuals operating bicycles on a roadway must comply with all applicable traffic laws. ²
